- 1. Origins and Secrets. Mimi uncovers the truth about her family's past only gradually. How do secrets shape the choices of different generations in the novel?
- 2. Mimi's Dilemma. What did you think of Mimi's decision to go along with the counterfeiting scheme? Was she trapped, complicit, or both?
- 3. Women's Power and Powerlessness. How do women in the novel exercise influence in families, businesses, and the underground economy?
- 4. Art, Authenticity, and Deception. Forgery and religious iconography are central to this story. What do these themes reveal about the line between truth and survival?
- 5. Migration and Identity. How do characters navigate cultural identity—Italian, Sicilian, American—especially in the face of poverty, illness, or criminalization?
- 6. Resilience and Resistance. In what ways do characters "mutiny" against the constraints placed on them? Who shows the most courage?
- 7. Pomegranates as Symbols. Why do you think the author chose this fruit as a central image? What might the seeds represent?
- 8. Then and Now. What parallels do you see between the world Mimi inhabits and today's social, political, or immigrant struggles?
